PROGRAM OVERVIEW

In the United States, approximately 7 million acutely ill medical patients admitted to the hospital each year are at increased risk for venous thromboembolism (VTE). It has also been reported that more than 12 million patients, comprising 31% of all US hospital discharges, are at risk of VTE. New guidelines have been developed by different organizations and new therapeutics have been approved to assist practitioners in identifying, preventing, and treating VTE. This program will focus on the emerging strategies and the safety and efficacy of anticoagulants, as well as the length of time they can/should be used in acutely ill patients who have been admitted to the hospital and post-discharge.
